# Be the Change! Faith in Action!

The Lutheran Office of Public Policy in California invites you to take part in their weekly Advocacy in Quarantine meetings. Each half-hour call includes an update on legislative actions and a quick advocacy activity.

Here in California, the Lutheran Office of Public Policy focuses its advocacy in these areas: Deep Childhood Poverty, Immigration/Migration, Housing Instability, Food and Farming, Water Justice, and Criminal Justice. Using the ELCA Social Statements to frame the conversation, LOPPCA chooses where specifically to elevate Lutheran voices in advocating for specific legislation working its way through the State Legislature and US Congress. Working alongside ecumenical partners such as Bread for the World, LOPPCA helps pass new laws dedicated to helping those in need.

#### Below are listed some important bills that LOPP-CA will be working on this year:

- 1. SB 108, as introduced, Hurtado. State Healthy Food Access Policy. This bill would declare that it is the established policy of the state that every human being has the right to access sufficient healthy food.
- 2. AB 221, as introduced, Santiago. Emergency Food Assistance for all. The State Department of Social Services shall provide a food assistance benefit statewide to low-income California residents, regardless of their immigration status.
- 3. AB 614 (Eggman)—"Farm to Food Bank" Tax Credit Overview: This bill would increase access to the food donation tax credit for agricultural growers by expanding the list of qualified donation items to food banks and other non-profit organizations by including other fresh food items not currently in statute, as well as various shelf-stable dietary staples.
- 4. Emergency food and diapers bill. (no number yet)

If you are interested in learning more about these and other current legislation, come hangout during the weekly Zoom meeting mentioned above.


