Jesus, the Light of the World

Publisher George D. Elderkin was part of the great flowering of church music in the evangelistic movements of the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries.

In this beloved gospel hymn he brought together two strands of text—Charles Wesley's beloved Christmas hymn and a refrain adapted from Fanny Crosby—with a "gospel waltz" melody that became popular in revivals and Sunday schools.

The images of light in this hymn are appropriate to Epiphany and any time we need reminding of our baptismal charge to walk, roll, or move in the light of Christ for the life of the world.
