#### **Update on Synod Leadership**

As many of you know, the recent Synod Assembly included actions regarding the continuation of Rev. Megan Rohrer as bishop of our Synod. Last Sunday, we shared what we could. This week more details have been made public.

Three main things happened quickly and almost simultaneously during Jun 4 – 6.

• Synod Council voted to ask Rev. Rohrer to step down as bishop after the Assembly closed

• Rev. Rohrer asked for a separation agreement between themself and the synod

• Presiding Bishop Eaton & the Conference of Bishops met and decided to suspend Rev. Rohrer from their position as bishop and to begin disciplinary proceeding.

For now, our synod will be led by the remaining staff and the synod vice-president with help from the conference deans. They will work with Bishop Eaton to discern next steps.
