## NEW MUSIC - All Creation Sings

Today: By Grace We Have Been Saved

It's a pleasure to sing a song today from musicians with ties to Bethel. Jonathan Rundman set out to write a folk/rock song for his 2006 album, *A Heartland Liturgy*, based on Ephesians 2:8-9 but ran into trouble finding an original melody for the chorus after subconsciously borrowing another song's tune. He emailed the words to Nate Houge, who was working at Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Church in Apple Valley, Minnesota. Nate wrote the melody for the chorus on the spot. The stanzas are a pastoral reminder that God has claimed us and is present with us.

Last Sunday: When It Seems the Day Will End

This song was commissioned by Humble Walk Lutheran Church in St. Paul, Minnesota, while Justin Rimbo was artist-in-residence there in 2011. He wrote the song steeped in the imagery of Lent and Easter, acknowledging the breadth of human experience in Christian life. The stanzas are rooted in promises of God's presence (Matt. 28:20), new birth (John 3), and God's dwelling in our hearts (Ezek. 36:26-27). The refrain is based on images from the beginning ("ashes") and end ("new life") of Lent. In an additional Bethel connection, Humble Walk Church, is led by Nate Houge's wife, Pr. Jodi Houge.
